



South-East side of Great Warley Street: Evelyn Heseltine's converted De Rougemont Manor Hotel, formerly Golding's House, is a substantial brick and tile-hung property constructed between 1894-1905. Currently unprotected, the property is situated outside the southern boundary of the Conservation Area. Wider estate buildings including the four Golding's Cottages opposite, are of similar date, designed by Ralph Nevill in the Arts and Crafts style. Further south lies the Church of St. Mary the Virgin, with its striking Art Nouveau interior fittings by William Reynolds Stephens and exterior lynch-gate, both listed as grade I and grade II* respective.

Recommendation: Extend the boundary to include the properties mentioned above, greatly increasing the size of the designated area half a mile along Great Warley Street southwards towards the De Rougemont Hotel. By giving the Golding Estate buildings conservation area designation, being of considerable local and historic interest, the patronage of Evelyn Heseltine can be further preserved and enhanced.
